The Henning Cultural Center and Brimstone Museum are proud to host the 2nd annual Chaos Theory art show, entitled "CTII: Chaos Reigns." This is an easy guide for submitting art to be featured in our gallery. Please read over this carefully, if you have any questions or need technical advice on hanging your piece, please call Thom Trahan or Eric Manuel at 337-527-0357. We are always interested to hear from you.

-SUBJECT MATTER: Our gallery is open to the public, which means anyone of any age can come through our doors and see the show. As a result, we must ask that you use common sense when choosing subject matter. We cannot feature nude art, sexually suggestive art, offensive political or religious images or messages, and extreme violence. If you are unsure if a picture contains any of the above, please bring it by so that Thom or Eric can look it over. We respect each of our artists' visions but we must also respect our community who makes all of this possible. A "No" from one of us is the final word. Please be respectful of Thom and Eric; we want your art here. Art must be submitted for approval digitally by June 24th.

-HANGING OR DISPLAYING ART: We would ask that all art submitted be in a frame unless it is cleared with us beforehand. If your art is not able to be displayed in a frame, please bring it by so that Thom and Eric can look it over. Please try and frame all art in dark frames with glass. For extra-large or oddly-shaped canvases, we would consider allowing gallery wrapped, unframed canvases. We also ask that a wire mount be added to the back if possible. Thom and Eric can help you with this if you need. If your frame has some other style of mount on it please bring it by and we can work something out. Thom and Eric are easy to work with and have a lot of experience with gallery hanging. Photographs must be framed, mounted, and matted if possible. If you are unsure of how to do this please come by and we will be happy to show you a few examples. If you work in clay or other 3D medium we have pedestals and tables to display your work on. Art must be physically delivered to the museum by July 8th at the absolute latest. Failure to deliver artwork on time will result in disqualification from the show.

- WHAT IS CHAOS THEORY?: Chaos theory began in 2009 as a concept exhibit which would allow artist specializing in various mediums to display their work without being limited to a specific theme. The artists were encouraged to bring anything from landscapes to tattoo art. The theme for CTII: Chaos Reigns has been narrowed down to feature art inspired by motion pictures, cartoons, videogames, and television shows. In keeping with the spirit of Chaos, we will consider artwork that does not fall within this theme. We strongly encourage artists to challenge themselves and attempt to create a piece within the theme.
